Countable vs. Uncountable

Nouns can be countable or uncountable.

Countable nouns can be counted, e.g. *an orange, 2 oranges, 3 oranges etc.*

How many oranges?

Uncountable nouns cannot be counted, e.g. *water, tea, rice, sugar etc.*

How much water?

Countable vs. Uncountable

Many is only used with countable nouns.

Much is only used with uncountable nouns.

Any is used for questions and negatives with countable and uncountable nouns.

Some is used for positive sentences with countable and uncountable nouns.

For example:

Questions	Answers
Do you have any apples?	Yes, I do. + No, I don't have any. -
Do you have any water?	Yes, I do. + No, I don't have any. -
How many apples do you have?	I have 3 apples. + I have some apples. + I don't have any apples. -
How much water do you have?	I have some water. + I don't have any water. -

Alba: Yes, lets buy 2 more carrots. Anything else?

Jack: Yeah, some eggs, chocolate, strawberries... Oh and some bread!

8. It's Sunday afternoon. Jack and Alba are going to the butcher, the baker, and the grocery store to buy what they need to cook dinner. Read the dialogues below and answer the following questions:

At the butcher:

Butcher: Good afternoon, how can I help you?

Jack: I would like around 400 grams of chicken breast please.

Butcher: Here you go. That's £4.50.

Jack: Thank you. Bye!

Butcher: Bye, have a nice day!

At the bakery:

Baker: Hello, how can I help you?
 Alba: I would like 2 baguettes please.
 Baker: Here you go. Anything else?
 Alba: No, that's everything thank you.
 Baker: Ok, that's £2 please.



At the grocery store:

Jack: So, what vegetables do we need?
 Alba: We need 2 carrots, 5 potatoes and an aubergine.
 Jack: OK great. Do we need any fruit?
 Alba: Yes, some strawberries.
 Jack: Alright... so now we have all of the fruit and vegetables. What else do we need?
 Alba: We need some milk, eggs, butter and chocolate.

Paying at the grocery store:

Cashier: Good afternoon.
 Jack and *Alba*: Good afternoon.
 Cashier: That's £25.37 please. Would you like to pay in cash or card?
 Alba: Card please.
Cashier: Ok. Please insert your card. Would you like the receipt?
 Alba: No, thank you. Bye!
 Jack: Thanks, bye!
 Cashier: Bye, have a nice day!
