Many adjectives in English have an “extreme” version. Learning and using these words can improve your English dramatically.

E.g. *Blue whales are big.*



*Blue whales are huge.*

#### Adjectives vs Adverbs

Adjectives are words which give information to nouns.

E.g. *The man is insane!* (*Insane* gives information to the noun: *man*)

To give information to a verb, "ly" is added to the end of an adjective, making it an adverb.

E.g. *He drives insanely fast!* (*Insanely* gives information to the verb *drives*)
