# Present Perfect vs Past Simple

#### <u>1. Read the story below.</u>

A loud, friendly voice woke Remi up. "Ladies and Gentlemen, we have arrived in Sydney, thank you for flying with French Airways, we hope you enjoy your stay." Remi and the other passengers slowly got off the plane.

Past simple is used to talk about events in the past that are finished.

Eg "I arrived in Sydney yesterday" or "Did you have a nice flight?"

Present perfect is used to talk about events that started in the past and continue in the present.

Eg. "*I have been on this flight for 6 hours!*" It can also be used for something that can change in the future. Eg. "*I have never driven a Ferrari before*"

The word "for" is used with present perfect when we are talking about a duration.

E.g. "I haven't seen my family for 8 months."

The word "since" is used with present perfect when we are talking about a specific time.

E.g. "I haven't seen my family since Christmas."
