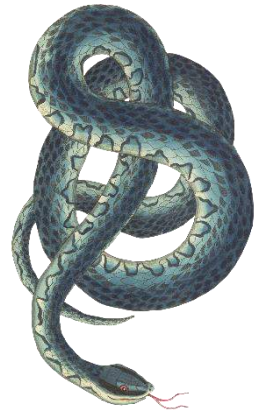


Dangerous Animals

2. Pairwork: with a partner read the animal facts below and match them to one of the animals in the box.

- You are hiking in the rainforest and a gorilla charges at you.

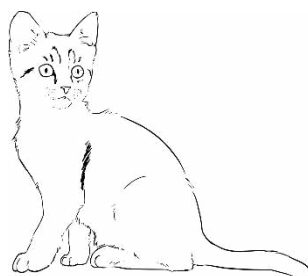
4. Read through the advice for the situations in exercise 3. How many did you get right?

- In the event that you are bitten by a snake, always try to remember the colour and size of the snake, as it will help doctors treat the venom. Try to move as little as possible, as movement will spread the venom through your system much faster. Do not attempt to suck the venom out of the wound.
- If a grizzly bear approaches you in the wild, walk away but do not run. Avoid direct eye contact, and if the bear charges you, hold your ground. You cannot outrun it.
- If a pack of wolves approaches you in the wild, slowly back away while holding up your arms and making yourself appear as large as possible. Maintain eye contact at all times. Under no circumstances should you turn your back on them.
- If a gorilla charges you, your best bet is to roll up into a small non-threatening ball. Do not make eye contact, do not attempt to scare it off with loud noises.
