Listening Script 1: Organizing the Party

Craig: Mmm Im not a big fan of Indian food, and besides, it's not very Christmassy. You have such a nice house, and James said you're an amazing cook. We should do it at your place.

Liz: Well... Im sorry I really don't want to. I don't like having a lot of people in my house, and I hate cooking turkey. I'm happy to help you organise, but I don't want to have a Christmas party at my house.

Craig: But me and Laura came to your house last weekend?

Liz: I don't mind having small dinner parties, but 14 is too many. I'm sorry Craig, I really don't want to have it at my house. Why don't we have it at your house?

Craig: I would love to, I love having big parties at my house, but my new apartment is way too small.

Liz: Ok, well I know a great Italian restaurant called Marios Pizza, we could go there?

Craig: Good idea, I love Pizza! I think everyone loves pizza actually.

Liz: Actually, I don't, but that's fine, they have really good pasta there, and Im always happy to eat a good pasta. Also I am pretty sure they are serving turkey around Christmas time. Do you want me to book a table at the restaurant?

Craig: No that's fine, I don't mind booking the table, but we should wait until we know exactly how many people are coming first.

Listening Script 2: After the Party
