Mark: Not really, Sarah. I have some concerns about the upcoming project. It feels overwhelming, and I'm not sure if I have enough support.

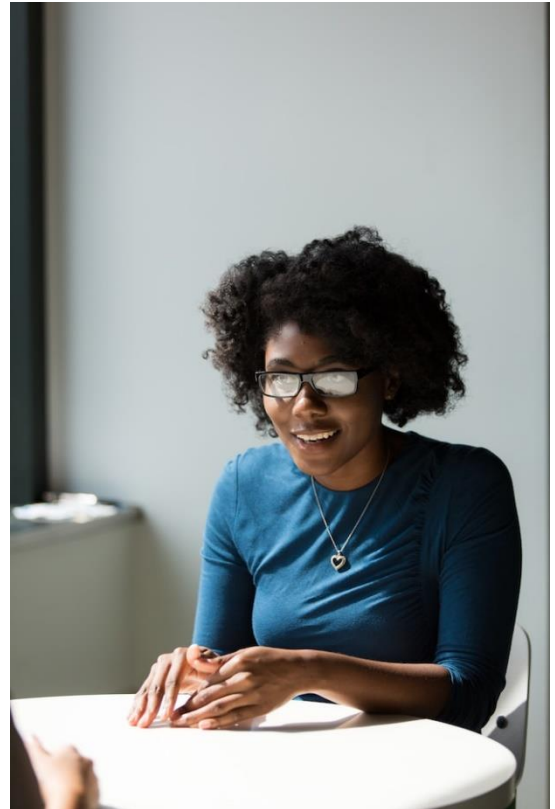

Present Continuous describes actions happening at or around the present moment, temporary situations, or ongoing actions.
