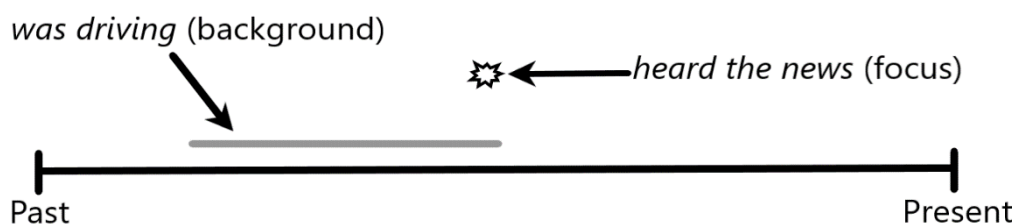


Past Continuous vs Past Simple

Past continuous is often used to give background information about a past event before describing the event itself. This is why past continuous is often called a “storytelling tense.” It can help set the background of a story. The structure is: was/were + verb + ing.

Eg. *I was driving when I heard the news*

Note that “was driving” is in the past continuous, but “heard” is in the past simple, showing it is the event to be focused on.



For they/we/you statements, “were” is used instead of “was.”

Eg. *They were driving to school when they ran out of petrol.*

Past continuous is also used to talk about an action that was in progress *at a specific time*.
 Eg. *At 9pm last night I was talking on the phone with my wife.*

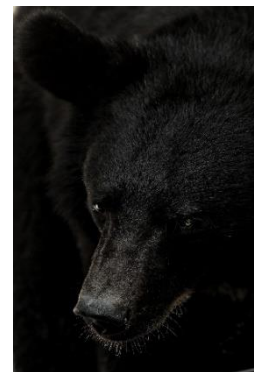


4. Read four people telling stories about “close encounters” with animals and choose between past simple and past continuous.



Caleb Minchin: “I grew up in Australia so snakes are nothing new, but when I was a teenager I (come) very close to being bitten. I (walk) on a path in the bush when I (come) across a fallen tree. I (step) on the tree and (jump) off. As I (come) down, I (look) down and (see) a brown snake all curled up. I think it (sleep), because usually snakes avoid people. My foot (land) directly on it, but I managed to jump away just as it tried to bite me. I (shake) for hours afterwards.

Tammy Dubious: "I (make) dinner one night when I (notice) my dogs waiting at the door. Usually that means they want to be let out, but that night they (act) differently, they (seem) nervous. I (go) to the door and (look) outside. A huge black bear (stand) there, holding a bag of marshmallows. He was only a few feet away, calmly watching us through the glass."



Ben Rollins: "This story is quite embarrassing. An elk (attack) me while I (take) a photo of it. Some friends and I (hike) in the woods when we (spot) a herd of elk. There were signs around the forest saying not to get too close, but they (seem) so peaceful. I (walk) up to them, and as I (try) to take the photo, the male (turn) towards me. He (charge) me and (hit) me as I (turn) to run. I (need) 10 stitches on my shoulder. I got a great photo though."



Mel Rawley: "Last year my sister and I (go) to Canada for holiday. One day while we (walk) in a park we (come) across a flock of geese. Where we live geese are pretty friendly, but apparently Canadian geese are notorious for being aggressive. Well my sister (not/know) that, so she (think) it would be funny to run towards the geese waving her hands and yelling. That was a bad idea. The geese all attacked us, and while we (try) to get away I (fall) over and (break) my arm. I hate Canadian geese now."
