

## Invitations and Making Plans



### Warm up:

#### **Save the Date!**

We're finally getting married! On July the 1st we are getting married at the Saint-Jean-Baptiste church in Lyon, France.

The ceremony starts at 5pm, but please arrive an hour early. We will provide snacks at the church, so please let us know if you have any special dietary requirements.

After the ceremony we are walking to a nearby bar, where we will have an open bar, so the champagne is on us! However, we have not organized dinner, so please bring one dish, anything from your country's cuisine would be great!

- a) Where will the wedding take place, and when should guests arrive? *Saint-Jean-Baptiste church, May the 1<sup>st</sup> at 4pm.*
- b) What should a guest do if they are vegan or vegetarian? *Let Dave and Julie know.*
- c) Who will be paying for the drinks? *Dave and Julie*
- d) What is the dress code for the wedding? *Guests should dress like 80's rock stars*
- e) What do you think RSVP means? *It means let us know if you are coming (répondez s'il vous plait)*
- f) Does this wedding sound like fun to you? What dish would you bring?

Present Continuous for the Future

Present continuous is a tense which is usually used to talk about something happening *right now*, in this moment.

For example: *"I am working at the moment, could you call back later?"*

The structure is: the verb to be (am/is/are) + verb-ing.

Present continuous can also be used to talk about future events.

For example: *"I am working on Monday, I can't go to the beach."*

When we use present continuous for the future, it is only used to talk about organised events.


For example: *"On Saturday I am meeting a friend at a café."* ✓

*"It is raining tonight."* ✗

The second sentence is not correct because rain is not something that is organised or scheduled. "It will rain tonight" is correct.

This means present continuous can be very useful when making plans with someone.

For example: *"What are you doing on Saturday? We are going to a movie, would you like to come?"*

3. Read the conversation about the wedding from the invitation on page 1 and circle 5 examples of present continuous.

*Joel:* Hey, would you like to come to a wedding with me next week?

*Diana:* Is that your way of asking me to marry you?

*Joel:* What?! No, no, that's not what I meant. Do you remember Dave and Julie? You met them last year at our dinner party.

*Diana:* Yeah, they were nice... well Dave was nice, Julie was a bit strange. She talks about the 80's a lot.

*Joel:* Well, *they're getting married* in July, and we can bring a plus one. So, would you like to come?

*Diana:* I'm not sure, *I'm visiting* my parents in July and *I'm also going* to a big work conference in June, so I'll be pretty tired. Can I let you know next week?

*Joel:* Actually, I need to know by Friday at the latest, we have to RSVP by May the first.

*Diana:* Ok, when exactly *are they getting* married?

*Joel:* Let me check the invite... *they're getting married* on the 1<sup>st</sup> of July.

*Diana:* I'm going to a yoga class on the first of July. What time does it start?

*Joel:* It starts at 5pm. *They're having* the ceremony first, and then *we're walking* to a bar nearby.

*Diana:* Ok, my yoga class ends at 2pm, so that should be fine. Thanks for the invite. Is there a dress code?

*Joel:* Yeah... Julie wants everyone to dress up like their favourite 80's rock star.

*Diana:* It's... an 80's themed wedding? I'm sorry but I forgot, *I'm having* dinner with friends on the first of July, so I can't come.

*Joel:* No problem, I understand. Do you think I'd look good as David Bowie?

#### Hours, Days, Months

When talking about hours we use 'at', when talking about days we use 'on' and when talking about months and years we use 'in.'

For example: *"The wedding is starting at 5pm."*

*"They are getting married on July the first."*

*"I am very busy in July."*
