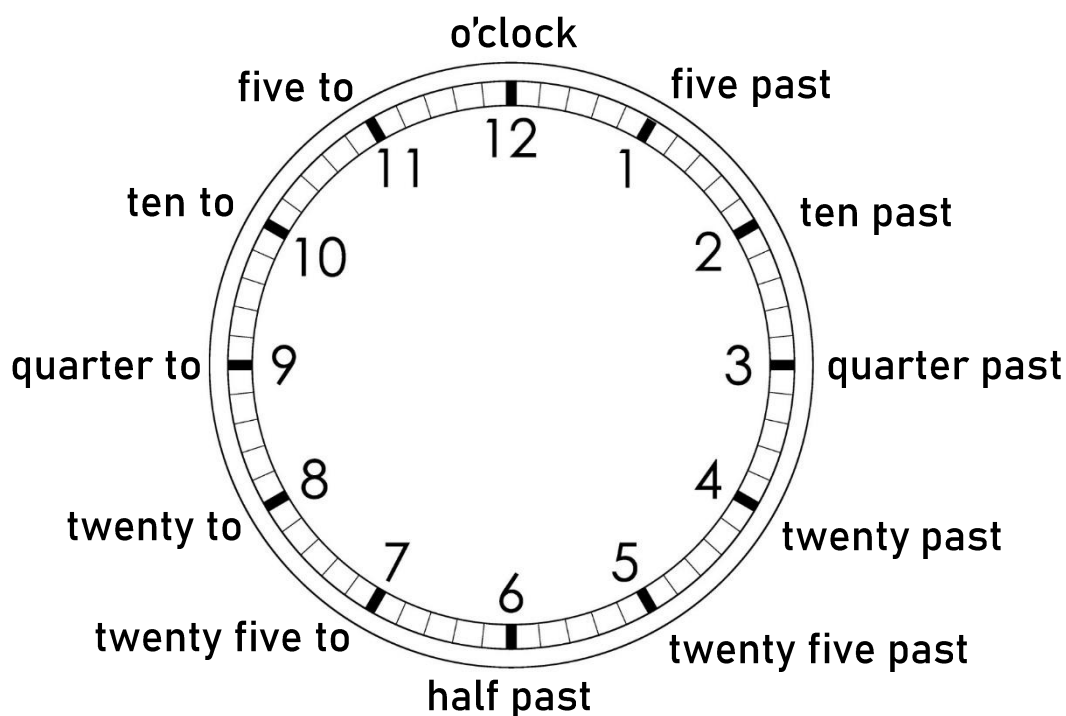

For example: *"I go to sleep at 11pm."*
