Qualifiers: How much?

Qualifiers are words that tell us how strong the adjective following them is.

For example, *"The food is quite spicy."* The word 'quite' is a qualifier, and tells us it is spicy, but not very spicy.

"The food is extremely spicy" means the food is very, very spicy. 'Extremely' is the qualifier.

'Slightly' means 'a little', for example *"The restaurant is slightly expensive, but the food was good."*

'Slightly' is usually used with negative adjectives such as 'cold' or 'tired'.

'Pretty' and 'Quite' mean more than a little, but not a lot. For example, *"The restaurant is quite expensive"* means more than 'slightly' but less than just 'expensive.'

'Really' and 'Very' mean a lot. For example, *"The restaurant is very good"* is better than *"The restaurant is good."*

'Far too' and 'much too' means something is much more than it should be. For example, *"This food is far too salty"* means the food is much saltier than it should be.

Bella Italia

I visited Bella Italia last Friday and had a really good experience. The restaurant is *quite* small, but the atmosphere is *pretty* friendly. My pasta was *slightly* salty, but it was still tasty. The portions were *very* large, so I couldn't finish everything. The service was *really* good, although the food was *way too* hot when it arrived, I burned my mouth! Overall, I would definitely come back.

The Green Garden

The Green Garden is a *very* nice restaurant with a beautiful outdoor area. The food was *pretty* fresh and the vegetables were *slightly* crunchy, which I liked. The restaurant was *quite* busy, but the staff were *really* friendly. However, my soup was *much too* salty and the dessert was *way too* sweet for me. On top of that, the prices were also *slightly* high. Still, I had a good evening.

Tony's Burger House
